Liam Tobin / Local History Day - Wednesday 23rd January @ 12 noon Who is Liam Tobin?



Major-General Liam Tobin's father, David Tobin, was from Cloughleafin, Mitchelstown. The Tobin family home still stands about a kilometre away at Cloughleafin, but is now in ruins. Early in the War of Independence, he became Deputy Director of Intelligence under General Michael Collins and became leader of a secret unit known as 'The Twelve Apostles'. This was the unit responsible for the selection and assassination of British soldiers, informants, members of the RIC and operatives of the British intelligence service, MI5. The unit assembled detailed profiles of everyone remotely connected with the British Government. This intelligence ultimately led to the assassination of a number of senior officials in Ireland. In October 1921, Tobin travelled with the Irish Treaty Delegation to London as part of Collins's personal staff.

Afterwards, Tobin commanded the Free State soldiers who took over Fermoy after it was abandoned by Republicans in the Civil War, thereby leaving a trail of destruction behind them. Based on intelligence information received in Fermoy, Tobin dispatched Free State troops to Lismore Castle where a firefight ensued with the Republicans. This ultimately saved Lismore Castle from the same fate as Mitchelstown Castle, and dozens of other buildings which had been looted and burned by Republicans a few days later.

After Collins was killed in August 1922, Tobin was chief pallbear of Collins's coffin through Cork and afterwards to Glasnevin Cemetery. He was appointed to succeed Collins as Director of Intelligence. Later, he became Aide-de-Camp to the new Governor General, Tim Healy. However, at the end of the Civil War in 1923, Tobin became deeply disillusioned with the new Free State Government. He subsequently joined the new Fianna Fail party and successfully repaired his relationship with de Valera.

What is happening?

On Wednesday, 23rd January at 12 noon, a plaque will be unveiled in Glenahulla National School to honour his memory as one of the pivotal figures in the War of Independence. On that night, in Mitchelstown, a public lecture will also be held to coincide with the centenary of the first sitting of Dáil Éireann, which takes place the following day.



The erection of the bronze commemorative plaque has been organised by Mitchelstown historian Bill Power, Ven. Archdeacon Gerard Casey (retired parish priest of Mallow and a native of Mitchelstown) and Dr Gabriel Doherty of UCC. It has been organised in association with the Tobin family and Glenahulla National School .

The school has a wonderful morning of activities planned in association with the unveiling. They will be focusing on the local history of Glenahulla and the surrounding area including the life of Liam Tobin. <u>All</u> <u>are welcome to attend.</u>

The lecture to Mitchelstown Heritage Society will be given by Céad Mile Failte go dtí Scoil Náisiúnta Glenn na hUlldh, ar son an lá stairiúil seo.
